If you answered P.—Non payment of property or real estate taxes on your home...YOU ARE PROBABLY CORRECT! Consider this:

If you own a modest home valued at \$50,000....and owe \$5,000 in property taxes, interest and fees; your home will be confiscated and sold through a tax sale or sheriff sale. Since the home can be sold just for the taxes and penalties owed, and NOT FAIR MARKET VALUE, it may be sold for just \$5,000. You get NOTHING. Your \$45,000 in equity or value is gone...confiscated by the government as part of the process.

How often have you seen someone convicted of the other crimes listed above ‘fined’ \$45,000....or having their assets confiscated in this amount? To confiscate \$45,000 in financial assets from a homeowner for a \$5,000 ‘violation of the law’ is itself criminal and perhaps, unconstitutional.

Tell your legislator you want the right to vote NOW on a constitutional amendment referendum that will permit the TOTAL ABOLISHMENT of all property taxes on homesteads and farmsteads (primary residences) in Pennsylvania.

Your Senator and Representative can push for passage of ‘emergency constitutional amendment referendum legislation’. That legislation would permit just one passage by the legislature...and then a vote by the public on whether the citizens favor amending the constitution to permit ABOLISHMENT of property taxes on homesteads and farmsteads.
